

## Asthma-ready classroom checklist

## What to know to get your classroom asthma ready

## Tick the boxes once you have completed the following:

| <b>/</b> | Identify students in the class with asthma. Review their Asthma Action Plan.   |
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|          | Talk to parents and students about their asthma. Assess potential triggers in the school environment. Do they need help to take their medicine?                  |
|          | Know the signs and symptoms of asthma and plan how you will manage an asthma emergency, both inside and out of the classroom.                                    |
|          | Be prepared for asthma emergencies: ensure students have access to their reliever and spacer.  |
|          | Keep the classroom clean and clutter-free. Reduce items that gather dust and dust with a damp cloth when the class is empty.                                     |
|          | Fragrance free or low odour products are best, such as cleaning products.  Avoid use of aerosol products.  |
|          | Teach students how they can stop the spread of virus' through hand-<br>washing, hand sanitiser, covering your mouth, cough into your elbow and<br>using tissues. |
|          | Keep windows closed when smoky outside or on high pollen count days.  Outdoor air can play a role in the air quality inside the classroom.                       |
